## Drug-drops a wise safeguard

King Kullen is taking local "shed-the-meds" efforts to a new level by setting up permanent collection boxes for unused medications in 11 of its grocery store pharmacies. The chain — partnering with the Citizens Campaign for the Environment, the Suffolk County Water Authority and the utility United Water — is taking advantage of new federal rules allowing pharmacies to collect unused drugs for incineration.
